### EXPERTS

**BÁLINT BACHMANN** \_ is professor for building design and rector at Budapest Metropolitan University. As an architect his scientific work wraps around sustainability and energy efficiency issues, as a leader he is part of an extensive (inter)national network on educational expertise.

**DÁNIEL BALÓ** \_ is an architect and member of an interdisciplinary collective of contemporary artists. He has initiated academic and independent works with a focus on the relation between nature and humans. Dániel is visiting professor at Moholy-Nagy University Budapest.

ILINCA CONSTANTINESCU \_ works cross-over from urbanism to visual arts, interested in large-scale perspectives and everyday lives. Ilinca is an architect and president of IDEILAGRAM association. She holds a PhD on shrinking cities and is an UAUIM academic in Bucharest.

eszter davida is an urbanist focusing on inclusive and sustainable developments. She has been leading the EU Interreg project DANUrB+ dealing with tangible and intangible heritage along the Danube. Eszter is a board member of KÉK Budapest and part of the New European High Level Roundtable.

MICHAL HVORECKY \_ is a committed European. He is one of the most successful Slovak writers and his novels have won numerous literary prizes. Often they address key sociopolitical and civilization-critical issues of European development in utopian-dystopian scenarios.

ELKE KRASNY \_ is a curator, cultural theorist, urban researcher, and writer. She is Professor at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna and has introduced the idea of care perspectives in architecture under anthropocenic conditions. Elke's numerous international lectures focus on emancipatory practices.

IVAN KUCINA \_ is an expert on Balkan issues. He has established an interdisciplinary architectural and urban practice that looks into the vague space of relationships between people, material things, and immaterial stimuli. Starting from Belgrade University he is now professor at Bauhaus School Weimar.

PETER LANGER \_ is a cultural manager and lecturer, responsible head of international cooperation at the European Danube Academy in Ulm. Peter has been visiting professor at the Bucharest University of Economics and driven many projects in the frame of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region.

DUBRAVA LAZIC \_ is a photographer, artist and Deputy Dean of the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad. With "River in Transition" she has recently curated a cross-Danube cultural project. It deals with an artistic exploration and hidden cultural heritage from four Danube bordering states.

TON MATTON \_ has established a practice between object-design, society-shape, ecological urban planning and artist-actionism. He is professor for space and design strategies at Kunstuniversität Linz, known for critical spatial strategies and performative research.

MÁRTON MÉHES \_ is a freelance project and cultural manager. He is initiator and board member of the international platform Danube Cultural Cluster, which is part of the European Strategy for the Danube Region EUSDR and lecturer for Cultural Studies at Andrassy University Budapest.

UTE MEYER \_ is an urbanist and Dean at Biberach University School of Architecure. She works in-between research and practice, focusing on peripheral territories and urban/rural mélange. Her initiative urbanes.land is tightly woven into regional and international networks.

**ULRICH SCHWARZ** is a landscape ecologist, cartographer and consultant engineer for geography. He is an expert for river and floodplain management in the Danube basin, founder and director of Fluvius, international consultancy. Ulrich is an academic at Vienna University.

ALEXANDER WETZIG \_ is a planner and has been markedly influential as the Deputy Major for Building and Ur¬ban Development in Ulm. He is Presi¬dent of the HfG Foundation board, initiator and inspirator of many projects in the spirit of HfGs design as well as political heritage
